

# Dear Confreres Greetings of Peace and Joy of Christ to you



Lenten season is marked by selected diet program and some even resort to physical exercises to cope with the concept of sacrifice. Some of us sparingly avoid consumption of certain food items on Fridays and slightly more fasting usually undertaken on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Whether such abstinence is as result of inward oriented strong faith expression is a question to be posed to all of us. It may be good to reflect upon the goals of Lenten observances. This season should assist us to understand and live the Gospel of Christ which is comprised of Jesus' life, teaching, passion, death and resurrection. To derive the essence of the Gospel or the underlying message of it, we need to know how Christ lived his life. He was preoccupied, fully engaged, spending

his every moment in going behind the lost and forgotten ones. He "preferred the flawed instead of the flawless." Today's most common man may push away such groups and go for more acceptable ones of their own category. Let Lenten observances strengthen us with such thoughts on the life Jesus lived. In this season, the lonely needs our voice of compassion, let us extend our hands of friendship to those who feel alienated, let the love of Christ repair broken relationships in our families and communities.

Our observances should not be confined to making certain sacrifices or giving up something. We need to still be conscious that what we possess is much more powerful than what we really give up. Jesus' love for his people surpassed all other things. The season gives us the freedom to choose our path. We are living in a time when Christians are being persecuted and killed for practicing their faith. We are fortunate to live in a country where we are free to practice our faith. But do we work to show our faith by concretely taking the message of Our Lord to others. Another goal of Lent is spiritual renewal. It is our practice we periodically clean off the unwanted dirt and dust in our homes or offices, similarly Lent reminds us to get rid of the unwanted habits and tendencies which takes us away from the path of God. Let the Lenten observances help us imbibe the spirit Jesus' love for his people. Let it enhance our faith journey to the extent of touching the life of our neighbor. I wish you, dear Confreres, a fruitful Lenten season in preparation for the feast of resurrection of Our Lord Jesus. Let us be good examples to our parishioners, students under formation, catholic faithful in our institutions and domestic staff in our Lenten preparations of making sacrifices in life.

#### Panderpalli Remembers Fr. Philip D' Souza in the Jubilee Year

St. Francis de Sales Church, Pandripalli, is all set to celebrate the Silver Jubilee Year of the establishment this Mission. When one reads the history of MSFS Odisha Mission, no one can surpass the stature of Fr. Philip D' Souza who single handedly steered the Mission to development in manifold dimensions. Having learnt Odia and Sadri for one year at Singarmunda Parish, he was appointed Parish Priest and Superior of Pandripalli in 1992, he carved out a community of faith from far out villages. Fr. Bijay says by sheer public relation skill with the faithful, he managed to get Mundagaon, Tillaimal and Kulga villages as part of Pandripalli Parish. His contribution in terms of structural development is unbelievable in a short span of nine years. They are construction of Pandripalli Parish Church, priests' residence, SFS Hostel and the Mission School. He began the construction of Divya Jyoti Minor Seminary, Village Church at Khuntodhoro, Mission School at Mundagon, Ponds at Pandripali and Barotengra, three open wells at Pandripalli, Etma Jharmunda and Latapara and three tube wells at Fitingpada, Malipada and Raidihi Village under Pandripali Parish, Raidihi Mission School in Raidihi Parish and purchased land for the Province at Bamra, Pandripalli and Latapara.

He was a man in hurry to execute as many projects as possible in short time. Today, Pandripalli has a strong Catholic Community with 11 sub-centers, 4 schools, 4 hostels and around 6000 people spread around 59 locations. Fr. Philip had done extraordinary works with limited resources. As the community is going to celebrate Silver Jubilee Year of the Mission, it is planning to construct a Parish Hall in memory of Fr. Philip D' Souza.

# Directives from Rev. Fr. Superior General in view of the Year of Formation for Mission of Mercy and Compassion

Rev. Fr. Superior General through his Circular SG-AB-10 has given directives to celebrate the year of Formation for the Mission of Mercy and Compassion. Although some house Superiors have already taken steps on the celebration of the year with the inauguration of the same, I give the following directives of Fr. General very specially spelt out for the information of all Confreres. 1. All communities are to formally

inaugurate the year of formation and close the year of consecrated life by 24<sup>th</sup> January 2017 with an hour of adoration before the Blessed Sacrament. 2. The theme MSFS formation for Mission of Mercy and Compassion is to be displayed in all communities and Centers. 3. Confreres will have to spend daily half an hour in adoration before the Blessed Sacrament. 4. Recite the special prayer prepared for the year of Formation for Mercy and Compassion. The responsibility lies on the Superior to animate the community on the expected line in this special year of the Congregation.

#### **Ongoing Formation program for all Members**

In the specially convened meeting of formators in Bangalore, it was decided that Province Councilor-incharge of Formation prepare a Province Calendar with the help of an expert team which is already being prepared tentatively by Fr. Benedict and sent to Fr. Noel Rebello for his approval and correction. The Provinces are expected to organize a three full day ongoing formation program for Confreres under the guidance of the Provincial and PCIC of Formation with assistance of the Formation forum. It is mandatory for all confreres to attend this program. Division of members decided for the retreat will be applicable to this program too. It is mandatory for all to attend this ongoing formation program. The scheduled date for the first group is 4<sup>th</sup>,5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> August 2016 and 22<sup>nd</sup>,23<sup>rd</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> September 2016 for the second group. Confreres are also free to take part in the ongoing formation program of other provinces.

### Mid-term Evaluatory Meeting by Asst. Superior General

There is going to be a mid-term evaluatory meeting of all apostolic communities from 18<sup>th</sup> April to 28<sup>th</sup> April 2016. Convenors and Secretaries will have to alert others and get ready with the preparations. ## **Delegated for Ordination**

We are happy and thank God for the gift of these new priests. Twelve of them is a record number which we will not have in the near future. Four of them will go to Mozambique. Due to my prescheduled visit abroad in April and TMM in Arusha, I shall not be able to attend the ordinations. Fr. Joseph Kailamangalam and Fr. John Britto Muthuswamy are delegated to represent the Provincial for these ordinations.

#### Our Sincere appreciations/thanks/congratulations to:

**Fr. Sandeep Tirkey** who has entered into agreement with a parishioner in Darkona for the purchase of land nearly an acre for the Church and presbytery. He is also exploring the possibility of purchasing a piece of general land in adjoining area for future educational needs of the Mission.

**Fr. Peter Dominic** who has been taking good initiatives to get rid of the many ill-reputed elements and groups moving around in St. John's Compound, Nagpur. Their numbers are on the decline. There were certain people who made special opening on the compound wall to leave their animals into the compound for long period of time. I heard it is being stopped with persistent efforts made through the guidance of Fr. Peter Dominic. Special efforts are taken to keep the surroundings clean and neat especially the primary school building. NFC is doing everything possible to secure the campus and regulate movements of people into the campus.

- **Fr. Emmanual Vattamattam** who has filed a contempt of court case against the Town and City Planning Department of Haryana at the advice of the Lawyer in Chandigarh on behalf of Delhi Fransalian Society for Sonipat land acquisition case. The Court had asked the department to respond why the land notified ten years back for public utility purpose is not acquired and used for the purpose for which it was to be notified. The government department did not respond to the notice of the Court which made our lawyer to file a contempt of court case against them. There is a possibility of the land de-notification.
- **Fr. Christopher Lakra** who has been doing a commendable job as parish priest of Pandripali, last two years with hectic pastoral visit to villages. Through his very amiable and obliging nature, he has won over people. Through his regular attendance at funerals and for other sacraments, he managed to contact many people through their relatives and restore the faith of around 48 families in a village near Badgaon who were otherwise not practicing faith. This village is going to be made a new sub-center of the Church. There are special catechetical programs arranged for them. The community has decided to develop two sub-centers for the Parish. He has also taken up parish preaching mission at his own parish level. This is what Holy Father remind us that the shepherd should have the smell of the sheep. Priests, who do not have contact with their people, hardly take part in the pastoral vision of the Church, and not visiting families and villages would be the worst complaint against a parish priest.

Initially, it was hard for him to even read. On his own, he went for Hindi Course in Varanasi. Now he gives homily and introduction during mass extempore. He is a good example and inspiration for the newly ordained priests belonging to non-Hindi speaking area.
- **Fr. Wilson Adakaparayil** who has completed the internal auditing of all communities, institutions and parishes for the year 2015. The council took ample time to study the report and suggested re-auditing of few communities. This is to make them fall in line with proper system of book-keeping and timely account maintenance. Fr Wilson is planning crash courses in computer program for religious people in Nagpur.
- **Fr. Bijay Kerketta** who is the Parish Priest of Ambapani has been taking many initiatives to develop our Mission. Plans to construct the presbytery is on along with the dispensary and convent for Sisters of Helpers of Mary. At the moment with the involvement of parishioners, local brick making on a large scale is being mooted for the construction of compound wall for the church property. Daily one-hour adoration is introduced in the Church which is being initiated to enhance Eucharistic Adoration.
- **Fr. Arun P** with great sense of perseverance undertook extensive paper work and correspondence and secured from Rome dispensation of Kuldeep Kiro from clerical state and religious vows. Fr. Arun P also succeeded in completing the dossiers of Mathew Ubale and Marshal Jadhav with much difficulty as the case is old and had to struggles for documents and testimonies. We are informed by our Asst Superior General that our files have reached Rome. Fr. Thumma Mariadas is also appreciated for speeding up our work in Rome.
- **Fr. Rajesh Lugun** who had come for his annual holidays have promised to provide a Church Bell for Panderpalli Chuch which he said will be sent from Germany by ship with the assistance of his parishioners.

**Fr. Sayu Cheruvil** who is the Principal of Badnera School has informed that the school secured recognition from Maharashtra Government up to Std. 8<sup>th</sup>. Now the School will have to work on the NOC from State Government for affiliation to Central Board of Secondary Education.

**Fr. Ignati Kshirsagar** who is the Principal of Neemuch School has been trying to bring up the school which is still in its initial stage. He is very good at computers and has designed certain simple software for student registration and students report cards, etc. He has done computer courses in Jhajjar selectively for designing such programs.

Two ASMI Sisters of Bhopal Province, **Sr. Nimmy and Sr. Shanti** who had rendered their services to Seraikela School for the past one year. The Provincial administration has decided to withdraw the sisters from next academic year. We acknowledge the services of these sisters with grateful heart. It may become more and more difficult to get sisters for such collaboration as there is shortage of sisters due to fall in vocations. We need to fill the gap with new arrangement of appointing coordinators with specific duties in the administration of the school.

**Fransican Clarist Congregation of Hazaribag Province** have agreed to collaborate with MSFS in Kandor Mission. They will be sending two sisters this year to take over the boarding for girls. We have just finalized the agreement with them.
