PCGC Meeting at the Provincial House, Nagpur



The Joint Meeting of the General Curia and the Provincial Curia was held on 20–21 February 2026 at the MSFS Provincialate, Nagpur. The meeting began with prayer and a warm welcome to the General Curia and concluded on 21st afternoon with lunch. It was a grace-filled occasion of dialogue, unity, and renewed commitment to our shared mission.

The Joy of Mission: A Harvest of Faith in Muliquela Diocese of Gurué, Zambezia, Mozambique

In the heart of Zambezia, where the red dust of the roads meets the vibrant green of the landscape, the Parish of Our Lady of Fatima in Muliquela a sanctuary of the Diocese of Gurué stands as a testament to the enduring power of the Gospel. Here, the "Joy of Mission" is not just a concept; it is a lived reality, visible in the miles traveled and the thousands of lives transformed.

The Parish is not confined to a single building; it is a network of 82 substations (outstations) scattered throughout the region, covering a distance of almost 90km. Each of these substations represents a community of the faithful who gather to pray, sing, and support one another, often waiting months or years for a priest to visit them. The joy when the mission car arrives is palpable. The fatigue of the long journey fades away when the missionary is greeted by the rhythmic beating of drums and the harmonies of a choir that has been practicing for hours.



The fruit of this labor is staggering. In recent times, the parish has celebrated almost 10,614 baptisms. This number is more than a statistic; it represents 10,614 individual "yeses" to God. In Muliquela, a baptism is rarely a quiet, private affair. It is a community festival, a public declaration of faith that reverberates through the village.

Alongside these baptisms, the parish has celebrated more than 270 marriages. In a modern world where the commitment of marriage is often challenged, seeing 270 couples stand before the altar in rural Mozambique is a powerful witness to the stability and sanctity of family life. These couples form the domestic churches that will nurture the next generation of the faithful.



Beyond the headline numbers, the daily life of the mission is filled with the administration of other sacraments—Confessions heard under the shade of mango trees, the Anointing of the Sick administered in mud-brick homes, and the Holy Eucharist celebrated with a reverence that transcends the humble surroundings. The "Joy of Mission" in Muliquela is found in the dust and the distance, in the struggles with malaria and the face of daily challenges. It is found in the priests and the catechists who walk for hours to teach the faith. Most importantly, it is found in the Christians who have found hope in the Gospel.



The Sanctuary of Our Lady of Fatima in Muliquela is a beacon in Zambezia, reminding us all that when the Church goes forth, the harvest is indeed plentiful.

Christmas, New Year, and Parish Feast Celebrations – 2025

St. John the Evangelist Church, CIDCO, Chatrapati Sambhajnagar, in preparation for Christmas organized a series of spiritual and community oriented programs, which were conducted prayerfully and successfully. As part of the spiritual preparation for Christmas, a one-day retreat was arranged for the faithful. Rev. Fr. Gilbert, OFM, was invited to lead the retreat and share his spiritual reflections. For three days of the Christmas carol singers consisting of committed parishioners and the parish youth visited all the families of the parish bringing to them and the neighbourhood the joy of Christmas.

The decoration of the Church and the preparation of the Christmas crib were carried out by the parishioners under the guidance of Rev. Fr. Marcus Ruptake, Parish Priest, and Rev. Fr. Biraj Minz, Assistant Parish Priest. The Christmas Vigil Mass was solemnly celebrated by Rev. Fr. Anto Depak, MSFS, with Rev. Fr. Lalji, MSFS, as the concelebrant. After Holy Mass, the parish community gathered to exchange Christmas greetings, and enjoyed cake and coffee. On 25th December, the morning Mass was celebrated by Rev. Fr. Marcus Ruptake, after which cake was distributed to the faithful.



On **31st December**, the Thanksgiving Eucharistic Adoration was from 10:30 p.m. to 11:30p.m., animated by Rev. Fr. Biraj Minz. He was also the main celebrant for the Holy Mass. The parish joyfully welcomed the New Year 2026 with by cutting a cake. On 4th January 2026, the Parish Feast was celebrated with solemnity. Rev. Fr. K. V. Joseph was the main celebrant. Many priests from the Diocese and other Congregations joined the celebration and shared a common meal with the parishioners. The Parish Priest expressed sincere gratitude to all parishioners and the Parish Council members for their cooperation, generous support, and valuable service in making these celebrations meaningful and memorable.

It was truly a grace-filled moment for all of us. A newly constructed Boys' Hostel was inaugurated by Most Rev. Fr. Johnson Kallidukil, Superior General of the MSFS Congregation, in the presence of Rev. Fr. Manoj Tirkey, Provincial Superior of the Nagpur Province.



The chief guest was given a solemn welcome through Santali rituals, including the washing of the feet and a traditional Santhal dance. Soon after the inauguration and the blessing of the new building, a short cultural programme was organized to thank Almighty God for the blessings and abundant graces bestowed upon us.

This initiative is a great opportunity for the local children to receive the basic education that many of them are otherwise deprived of. Nearly 250 students reside at SFS Hostel, Kandor, where they are provided with accommodation, education, and Christian values. They grow in their knowledge of Christ and moral living, even though some of them come from Hindu or nature-worshipping families.



The ultimate aim of the mission is to “make Christ known through education,” so that the light of Christ may shine in society.

The newly ordained priest, along with the Bishop and other priests, was escorted to the stage to the rhythmic beats of the drums, the nagera and a traditional chain dance. The family members of new priest felicitated all the guests with a bouquet of flowers and a shawl as a gesture of gratitude and honour. The Nagpuri and Sambalpuri dances added vibrant colour and joy to the event. The entire program was well organized by the Parish priest, the assistant parish priest, the deacon, members of the ordination committee and the parishioners. The celebration concluded with the blessing of the newly ordained priest.
